Dear Brookfield Families,

Welcome to Brookfield School. We know that starting a new school year is a transition, and we are here to support you. Below you will find some helpful tips in preparing your child for school with Brookfield, along with valuable information regarding the upcoming school year.

As you and your child become acquainted with the school, please feel free to reach out to your child's teachers and administrators with any questions, concerns, or suggestions. Our goal is to provide your family with an amazing experience.

We are so excited to welcome you to our program and look forward to supporting you and your child as they grow into kind, resilient students who feel loved, cared for, and valued at school!

On the first day of school, escort your child into the classroom. Teachers will be there to meet and greet each child. We ask parents to limit their drop off time to 10 minutes. A quick drop off is often best for the parent and child. Ask a teacher for tips to help make drop off easier.

Tuesday is a busy day, please pack a healthy snack and lunch, and a labeled water bottle. Please remember we are peanut and nut-free, and allergy aware school. Label your lunch box with acknowledgment by using alternative such as "sun butter."

Beginning this year, students in Early Kindergarten are expected to wear a red shirt (no collar required), or a red dress. They may have any bottoms.

^{*}Students may not wait unsupervised for parent pick up. (Please remind your child to go to the After School Care area, where they can wait under supervision for you.)

Extended Care

Extended Care Hours begin at 7:30 am and end at 6:00 pm. If you require occasional extended care for your child, please arrange this in advance through the front office for proper staffing. The rate for extended care drop-in is \$20.00 per hour. Regular extended care participants call the billing office (775.825.0257 ext 5) to arrange payment. Scheduled extended care is a pre-paid discounted fee.

There is a \$2.00/minute charge in 5 min. increments, \$10 per 5 minutes, charge for care after 12:30 pm for half-day children and 6:00 pm for after care children. You will be billed.

^{**} Pick-up times are 15 minutes after the bell. After 15 minutes, your child will be signed into After School Care, and must be signed-out by a parent or authorized person.



Emergency Information

It is imperative parents update all information with our school. Please update your contact information, child's health information, and more on the family form included. Please make sure your child has at least 3 other adults who are able to pick up your child within 1 hour if needed.

We are asking to only have contacts listed as a pickup if they are able to come get your child, otherwise please list them as an emergency contact. Please note all contacts, pickups and emergency, will be contacted by alert system during a drill, test, or actual event.

Allergy-Aware And Nut-Sensitive School

We make every attempt to be a nut-free campus. Please adhere to our request of no nuts. Please check the labels as nuts are in many products. This is for the safety of our children. Any suspicious allergens will be removed and saved for you. If you are packing alternative butter sandwiches, please label the food to inform your teacher. We encourage healthy foods and ask that sweets be kept at home.

At Brookfield School, we are dedicated to maintaining open and efficient communication with our parents. To ensure you stay informed and connected, we utilize the Remind communication system. Remind allows us to send timely updates, important announcements, and classroom information directly to your phone or email. This easy-to-use platform helps bridge the gap between home and school, ensuring you are always aware of your child's educational journey and any school events or activities. Your engagement is crucial, and Remind helps make staying informed simpler and more convenient.



At Brookfield School, we take the health of our students and staff seriously. If your child is sick and needs to stay home, kindly inform us of the absence and symptoms by calling the school at 775-825-0257 extension 2 or emailing attendance@brookfieldschool.com.

To maintain a healthy campus, we request that students showing signs of illness refrain from coming to school. To facilitate a full recovery and prevent the spread of illnesses, children and staff will be asked to remain at home until symptoms subside for at least 24 hours. Depending on the nature of the community illnesses the school may require a longer period of recovery before returning to school. In the unfortunate event that a child shows signs of illness or becomes unwell while at school, the parents will be notified of their symptoms and the child will be in the office while awaiting pickup. Rest assured, our priority is always the care and comfort of your child.

School Safety

Our top priority is the safety of our students. Therefore, we will strictly adhere to the school's procedures regarding student safety, visitor and volunteer requirements, as well as the interactions between parents, staff and students. Brookfield continues to be a safe and orderly environment, encouraging quality and rigorous instruction that leads to outstanding academic achievement for all students.

All visitors must check in at their campus office. Visitors will be required to present their driver's licenses to be copied. All visitors must wear a visitor badge. Staff must also have visible ID badges on campus. All families must have a security card or access code to obtain access on to the campus.

Security cards and access codes will be available to pick up at the popsicle party/ ice cream party and the first day of school. Security Cards only give access to the Elementary Campus for families between the hours of 7:30 am to 9:00 am and 3:00 pm to 6:00 pm.

Students may only be picked up by someone authorized to do so. Please ensure anyone picking up is listed on your student's FACTSIS account. If you are picking up your child early, please sign the student out of the office. The office will call your child out of class. For continuity of instruction, please avoid scheduling any appointments 30 minutes prior to your student's dismissal time.

Student Placement

Classrooms have been balanced both academically and socially. Careful consideration is given to the placement of students input from staff and families, as well as student learning styles. Our class lists are structured to provide equitable class sizes at each grade level. Pleasecreate or login to your Parent's Web account to see your student's placement.

Uniforms

Dress code is mandatory for all Early Kindergarten through 8th Grade students. Students coming to school out of uniform will be sent to the office. The dress code is detailed below. If there is aquestion on whether a garment or style is acceptable, do not wear the item until it has been approved by the administration. Please ensure all articles of clothing are plainly labeled with the student's name.

Some acceptable uniform items (bottoms, jackets, sweatshirts) may be purchased at the "school uniform" sections of stores such as, Wal Mart or Target. These additional items must match our colors exactly, with no logos. Tights and leggings under dresses and skirts must match the school colors and be free of any patterns or decorations. Sweaters andsweatshirts, pull over or button up, must match the school colors.

Students are expected to meet dress code standards on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday. Students must wear their assigned uniforms on Wednesdays and for any field trips or special events. Students may wear spirit wear on Fridays, provided it meets the dress code and guidelines below.

Early Kindergarten

Students in Early Kindergarten are expected to wear a red shirt (no collar required), or a red dress. They may have any bottoms.

Accessories

Jewelry/accessories that could be deemed a safety hazard or are disruptively excessive in-size, style,or number are not allowed. Body piercing is unacceptable expect for the ears: one studin each ear is allowed. Bracelets and necklaces should not be worn at school.

Sunglasses and hats may be worn outside on the playground. They must be removed and stored in a backpack or cubby when in the classroom or during instructional times.

Backpacks

For the safety and tidiness of our students and campuses, roller backpacks of any kind willno longer be allowed at Brookfield School. All backpacks should be soft and able to be carried on a student's back. Please refer to the following:

Free Dress Days

On "Free Dress" days, the dress code for shoes, hair, makeup, and accessories must be followed. Please use common sense and follow our guidelines for modesty and neatness. Please note following items are not acceptable:

Extreme styles, including baggy or oversized items, ragged edges, holes in clothing, or visible underwear.

Short, tight or revealing apparel, unbuttoned shirts, overly revealing clothes, such as bare-midriff or spaghetti-strap tops, tank tops, short shorts (shorts must be no shorter than 2" above the knee no matter what is worn underneath), tube tops, sheer clothing, tights, or spandex worn as outerwear, etc. Torn or ripped leggings or tights. Clothing or personal items that support alcohol, drugs, gangs, profanity, sexual conductor violence, such as T-shirts with logos or ads, etc.

Hair

Hair must be kept out of face and eyes during instructional times. Hair color should be natural, or in natural tones. Modest highlights are acceptable. Hairstyles should not be distracting or disruptive to the teaching/learning process in class or on campus. No extreme styles or unnatural colors are allowed. Spiked hair may not be longer than one inch.

Iackets

Solid school colors.

Makeup

No makeup is permitted for students in Pre-1st through 5th grade. Lip gloss/ Lip balm can be worn. Girls in 6th through 8th grade can wear light make up in neutral shades.

Pants/Shorts/Skirts

All dress code and uniform pants must be khaki-style with a button closure and a zip-fly inkhaki or navy color. For students in Pre-1st and 1st grade, pants may have an elastic or tie waist No yoga pants, sweats, leggings, or tight, legging-style pants/skinny jeans. Pants and shorts must be worn at waist level. They must fit properly at the crotch and must not be baggy/oversized.

Shorts/Skirts should be modest in fit and length. Skirts and shorts may not be shorter than 2" above the knee. No denim and no cut-offs. No frayed knees or hems.

Shirts

Collared, long-sleeve or short-sleeve in solid white, or navy.

Shoes

Must always be worn, always with socks and tights. Shoes must have closed toe and heel; maximum

heel height is one inch. Shoelaces must always be laced and tied properly. All shoes should be closed toed and considered safe for active outdoor play.

Spirit Fridays

On Fridays, students may wear any Brookfield School Spirit shirt and uniform-colored pants. There will be several opportunities to get Brookfield Spirit Wear throughout the year. Students without a spirit shirt should wear white, or navy collared shirts.

Sweatshirts

All sweatshirts are to be in solid school colors.

Reminder

We are partnered with Land's End Uniforms and our school plaid is Classic Navy Plaid. Girls in Pre-1st through 2nd grade will be wearing the Classic Navy Plaid jumper. Girls in 3rd through 4th grade will be wearing the Classic Navy Plaid skirt or skort. The Classic Navy Plaid is optional for 6th through 8th grade girls. All students in 6th – 8th Grade are required to wear the Brookfield School blazer on uniform days. You may order the plaid items and blazer online at www.landsend.com/school with the code 900061771.

Dress Code and Uniforms by Day Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday

Students are expected to wear a combination of the following:

- White, or navy collared shirt, long or short sleeves
- Khaki or navy slacks, shorts, or skorts
- Grade-level appropriate plaid dress or skirt (uniform items are allowed every day of the week)

<u>Uniform Dress</u>

Wednesdays or Field Trips(unless otherwise specified)

Boys:

- Pre-1st through 4th Grade: White collared shirt, navy slacks or shorts
- 5th through 8th Grade: Brookfield School Blazer, white collared shirt, khaki pants or shorts

- Pre-1st and2nd grade: Classic Navy Plaid jumper and white collared shirt
- 3rd through 4th grade: Classic Navy Plaid skirt and white collared shirt
- 5th through 8th Grade: Brookfield School Blazer, white collared shirt, khaki pants, shorts, or skorts
